Jack Clark, a 427 (London) Wing member for twenty years, turned 90 on May 14th, 2020. Because of COVID-19, his family was not permitted to celebrate with a social gathering so developed a creative way to mark the occasion. “We decided to ask friends, family and colleagues to send their birthday wishes by video,” said his daughter Peggy Clark. “We were deeply touched with over 50 replies, including a personal message from Lindsay Mathysen, MP London Fanshawe and a collaborative effort from the 862 Lambeth Lightning Squadron.”

Jack’s daughters (Debbie, Sherry, Lori, and Peggy) wished to highlight his life-long dedication to serving Canada. Without knowing where to start, they reached out to Brent Elgie and Sam Newman from the 427 Wing who suggested they contact Captain Susan Graystone of the 862 Squadron. “Captain Graystone worked with my dad for 15 years in his capacity as Cadet Liaison” continued Peggy. “Her contribution was instrumental in the creation of The Jack Clark Leadership Award.”

The award will be presented annually to the cadet who shows exceptional leadership by motivating and encouraging others to do their best. Jack was honoured and present the first award to WO1 Paige Wakelin during the virtual ceremony at this year’s 862 Lambeth Lightning ACR. Jack joined the cadets at a young age and soon after, spent 5 years in the Navy. At the age of 24, he joined the RCAF where he spent 20 years before retiring at the age of 44. After his retirement from the Air Force, he joined the Ministry of Transportation where he worked for an additional 19 years.

Jack joined the 427 (London) Wing on May 8, 2000, and has been an active member, serving in several positions, including: President, Immediate Past President, 1st Vice-president, and Air Cadet Liaison Officer for approximately 15 years – where he built long-term relationships with cadets and staff members at each squadron.

OAS/GIS one-time payments to seniors expected week of July 6, 2020

On June 4, 2020, Prime Minister Justin Trudeau delivered a much-anticipated update for seniors on the one-time, tax-free payments of \$300 for seniors eligible for the Old Age Security (OAS) pension, and the further \$200 for seniors eligible for the Guaranteed Income Supplement (GIS).

Since the one-time payments were announced nearly a month ago, many have wondered when they can expect to receive the funds. Some older Canadians are struggling. They have seen increased grocery costs, new fees to access deliveries, and some have lost a source of income.

The federal government has announced that the one-time payments will be delivered the week of July 6, 2020.

Seniors do not need to apply for this one-time special payment. The payment will be issued automatically during the week of July 6, and seniors who reside in Canada can expect to receive the payment by direct deposit or cheque that week. For seniors who reside outside Canada, the one-time payment will also be issued in July for those on direct deposit, but delays can be expected for cheques, given international postal disruptions.

In collaboration with patients and their families, the Canadian Medical Association, the College of Family Physicians of Canada and the Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Canada have created a guide to help patients prepare for "virtual visits" with their doctor. It focuses on video visits, although it is also possible to receive virtual care through phone calls, text messaging and email. 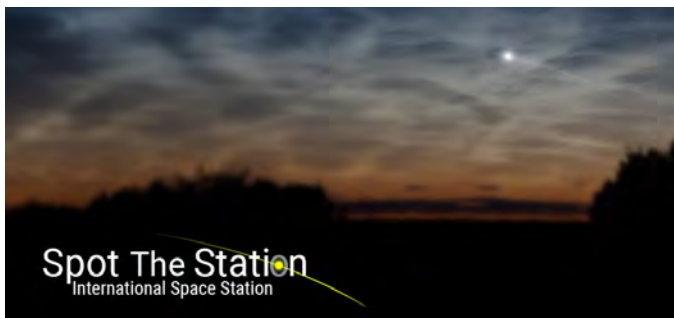

WWII Spitfire Pilot sees film of his crash landing after 61 years

An 18 year-old just out of high school was trained to take pictures of damage done to German targets by B-17s. He flew a British Spitfire fitted with extra fuel tanks where the guns were. At 18 years old, he was all alone behind enemy lines, with no guns and no escort.

Stored for 61 years in two suitcases of 16mm home movies that were inherited by filmmaker William Lorton from his great uncle who served as a Flight Surgeon were 3 hours of war footage that included a compelling crash landing of a Spitfire in 1944. Mr. Lorton tracked down the pilot in the crash and arranged to interview him.

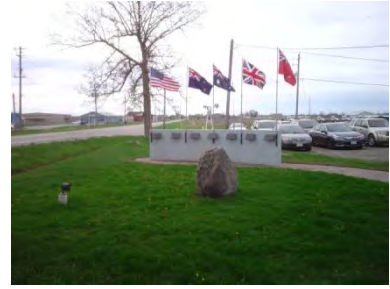
Then 83 years old, imagine his reaction when he was shown the film and realized it was him!

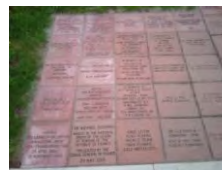

Stay Calm and Carry On *by Linda Brimson*

We hear much talk of the economy today – local businesses closed or struggling, provincially-mandated essential services; and the world economy. A couple years ago, I realized there is another critical grassroots economy, one that 427 (London) Wing RCAF Association plays a part in.

I'm referring to the non-profit and registered charitable groups and their army of unpaid volunteers. Take a moment to think about all the important work these groups and their devoted members offer - week in, week out across this great country of Canada.

These volunteers are most definitely an essential service to the people and projects they work for and support. There are the social agencies that offer help to people experiencing domestic violence, homelessness, addiction. There are groups supporting the lonely and isolated, for example the Alzheimer Society. There are volunteer workers in the hospitals, Long Term Care homes and schools. All these organizations cannot function without their volunteers to fundraise, offer hands-on work, be drivers, answer the phones, make deliveries, support outreach efforts in the community.

There are the arts and entertainment organizations. At times naysayers dismiss the value of art, music, and performance in dire situations, insisting they are unnecessary. History has proven humans need the creative release and connection that art in all its forms bring to both artist and viewer.

The environmental groups are essential to earth's health and recovery from abusive practices. In London I have been thrilled to volunteer a few times with Reforest London. There is a wonderful feeling when planting trees for a future legacy. And so many young people are involved and knowledgeable, it is wonderful to see.

Today our 427 (London) Wing is at a crossroads. Even before the current catastrophe of a worldwide pandemic, some

people questioned whether historical service groups may have outlived their usefulness. Long-time service groups such as Legions, Lions and Kin Clubs, and dozens of other non-profits face challenging times.

How each individual group chooses to respond will say something about their leadership, their will to survive and commitment to serve their communities. In many groups, lack of funds will be the final nail in the coffin. When groups cannot meet their monthly expenses, there are few options.

Please know the directors of your 427 Wing have been meeting weekly via telephone conference. Plans were being discussed re fundraising months ago. There are commitments and brainstorming sessions to deal with each week's crisis and survival planning. Members are most welcome to offer positive suggestions and ideas.

Your directors do not operate within a bubble of unreality. They face the harsh reality that many non-profit and charitable organizations may not survive this unprecedented time where groups cannot host their events to generate funds. Our members are in the high-risk group for the COVID-19 virus due to age or possible health challenges. We pray each of our members and friends are able to take necessary precautions.

No one knows the future. The virus is calling the shots. I take comfort in the resilience and goodness of people within the Wing, and within my community and country. Canadians respond well when asked to be generous and when confronted with tremendous challenges. Earlier generations have given us a great example – Stay Calm and Carry On, works well.

Each day I count my blessings and remind myself I have much to be thankful for. Most of us are serving our forced confinement in the comfort of our homes, with sufficient food and the means to maintain human connections. In this unusual time, let's open our hearts to the suffering of others, remain committed to our goals of service and unselfishness, and rededicate ourselves to a purposeful life.
