

The First Nations, Metis, and Inuit peoples of Canada have a long and proud tradition of military service to Canada. In honour of June Indigenous History Month, check out this #RemembranceMoment produced by Veterans Affairs Canada for their inspirational stories. (left to right) Francis "Peggy" Pegahmagabow, Charlotte Edith Monture, Thomas George "Tommy" Prince, Bertha Clark-Jones, David Greyeyes-Steele. These are just some of the Indigenous-Canadian members who throughout history, gave so much in service and sacrifice to our country. Despite their achievements on the battlefield, Indigenous-Canadians were not always treated as equals back at home and faced racism and other undue cultural challenges. Still, they remained steadfast and dedicated their lives to increasing social and economic opportunities for Indigenous people. The story of Indigenous service in the #CAF is one of a proud and rich heritage. Their courage and accomplishments are deservedly a source of pride to their families, communities and all Canadians.





Henry Louis Norwest was a Métis sniper from Fort Saskatchewan, Alberta, who served with the Canadian Expeditionary Force during the First World War. In less than three years, he achieved a remarkable 115 confirmed kills with the 50th Canadian Infantry Battalion. Known for his unmatched camouflage skills, patience, and humility, he was both revered as a hero and feared by his enemies. He would lie in wait for days in No Man's Land, choosing his shots carefully to ensure his position remained secure. Under the cover of darkness, he would skillfully infiltrate enemy lines, striking them from behind at first light, evading detection throughout the day, and slipping away unnoticed the following night. During the Battle of Vimy Ridge, Norwest achieved an impressive 59 kills before the final offensive. He earned the Military Medal for his gallantry during the defence of "The Pimple," where he played a pivotal role in repelling German counterattacks. He was also awarded a bar for his Military Medal in honour of his valour. Norwest was killed in action during the Battle of Amiens, while bravely eliminating multiple machine gun positions singlehandedly. Laid to rest at the Warvillers Churchyard Extension in Somme, France, his legacy lives on.

#### Field Exercises for 31 Signal Regiment:

The Wing welcomed 31 Signal Regiment to Field Exercises on June 24-25, 2023 on Wing property. This is an important piece of emergency preparedness and we can be grateful for their efforts. London Amateur Radio Club volunteers are a vital part of this event.

Here's an earlier post from London Amateur Radio Club Facebook page:

LARC Field Day Band Captains met last Saturday at the club station to plan out this year's Field Day, June 24th 18:00 UTC to June 25th 18:00UTC. LARC plans to be 7A, with an additional bonus satellite contact station. The event will be held on the grounds of the 427 Wing at 2155 Crumlin Rd. due to the easy access, clean washrooms, immediately available shelter in the event of storms, kitchens, BBQ, and ample parking.

Ropes for dipole antennas will be shot into area trees on Friday, and antenna raising will start at 10am Saturday. In the plans are antennas for 160m through 6m.

31 Signals will be present with their air-conditioned communications truck and a mil grade tent will be put up just north of the wing building for some of the LARC radio stations. 31Sig plan to focus on 40m SSB with their big NVIS array.

All LARC members are encouraged to come out and take part in the action, get on the air for a little while, help with set up and take down, have a burger or hot dog at Saturday's Pot Luck, and enjoy the spirit of Field Day.



## **RCAF Training Tragedy**

Canadian Forces members risk their lives every day. Theirs is a dangerous career and sadly, there are deaths in training, not just in conflict situations.

In accordance with the wishes of their families, the Royal Canadian Air Force is releasing the names of the two air crew members killed in the CH-147F Chinook crash on June 20, 2023, near Garrison Petawawa, Ontario. The deceased members are:

Captain David Domagala, 32, originally of Woodstock, Ontario, served in the Canadian Army Reserve before applying to become a pilot. After graduating from the Royal Military College, he completed pilot training and was posted to 450 Tactical Helicopter Squadron in 2019. He deployed as a liaison officer on Operation CALUMET in Egypt, for which he received a Commander Commendation from Canadian Joint Operations Command. He commenced his training on the CH-147F Chinook upon redeployment.

Captain Marc Larouche, 53, originally of Amos, Quebec, earned a private pilot's license before joining the Royal Canadian Air Force as a pilot. After attaining his pilot's wings in 1993, he served with several squadrons, flying the CH-135 Twin Huey, CH-146 Griffon and CH-147F Chinook helicopters. He deployed internationally on Operation DELIVERANCE in Somalia and domestically on Operation PODIUM in British Columbia.

As we grieve, the Royal Canadian Air Force asks the media and public to respect the privacy of the families of the fallen. Rest in peace. We will remember them.
